Pharm.D.

Our program is a 4-year program that is joint with Oregon State University and Oregon Health & Science University. The first two years of the program are traditionally spent at OSU and the third is spent at OHSU which means that students get access to two very different patient populations and student experiences. Our third-year students take coursework at OHSU and the interprofessional experience from being on an academic

hospital campus is amazing. We are the only Pharmacy school that rotates at OHSU and many of our students intern there. Additionally, our APPE rotations are very flexible and extremely personalized. All our students meet one-on-one with the director of experiential education to plan out their specific rotation set. No two students have the same 8 rotations. Our program also has faculty who are also clinicians which means they are also practicing pharmacists, so they understand what it's like out there in the real world.

Important Notes & Resources

Important Notes:

- All prerequisite courses must be graded and completed with a minimum of C- grade (1.7) on a 4.0 scale.
- Any prerequisite course that is a D+ or below must be retaken.
- The Prerequisite Science GPA is calculated as the application is processed. The courses with asterisks above are part of the Prerequisite Science GPA. When calculating prerequisite science GPA, the highest grade for the course, if there are repeats, will be used.
- A bachelor's degree is not required for admission to the Doctor of Pharmacy program. Students interested in pursuing a dual-degree are encouraged to complete a bachelor's degree as it is a requirement for the OSU Graduate School. Dual-degree options are the Pharm.D.-Ph.D. and Pharm.D.-MBA.
